CLIMATE & WEATHER IN CAYMAN BRAC

Cayman Brac enjoys summer like weather all year round. Lying between the latitudes of 19° and 20° North, in the far Western Caribbean, Cayman Brac is tempered by cooling trade winds.

Temperatures reach highs of 29°C (85°F) to 32°C (90°F) during the summer months of July and August. Relative humidity varies from 68% to 92%.

Temperatures are coolest during February, ranging from 22°C (72°F) to 30°C (86°F) during the day and 17°C (64°F) to 22°C (72°F) at night. The sea temperature ranges from 25°C (78°F) to 27°C (82°F) in the winter months and from 27°C (82°F) to 30°C (86°F) in the summer.

Location

Grand Cayman and its sister islands are located just south of Cuba in the Caribbean Sea approximately 1-hour flight south from Florida, USA (Miami, Fort Lauderdale).

Cayman Brac is one of three Cayman Islands and a Sister Island to Grand Cayman and smaller, nearby neighbor, Little Cayman. The island is roughly 14 square miles—approximately 12 miles long and 1.2 miles wide. It was named for the 140-foot bluff (called a “brac”) at the western tip.

Compared to its sister islands, Cayman Brac has a more rugged terrain with a sweeping lime-stone bluff, caves and several hiking trails. Its natural beauty and breath-taking scenery make it the ideal place to explore.



WHAT TO SEE ON CAYMAN BRAC

Brac is Gaelic for bluff, named after the limestone ridge that runs down the centre of the island reaching an elevation of 150ft at the eastern end. This is also the highest point on all three islands.



The friendly 'brackers' share their Island with over 200 different bird species and numerous iguanas. The dramatic scenery and rugged terrain boasts a plethora of hidden caves and winding trails that the whole family will love exploring. The atmosphere is tranquil, crime is almost non-existent and the people are friendly and welcoming. Cayman Brac is also famous for its superb diving, which should not be missed.

West End


In Cayman Brac's West End you will find the airport, grocery stores, a gas station and a couple of condo complexes in this area. The north shore of the West End has the highest population of residents on the island. The famous Russian wreck dive, lies just offshore.

Eastern Districts

WEST END

The north shore of the West End has the highest population of residents on the island. The famous Russian wreck dive, renamed M.V. Capt. Keith Tibbetts, lies just offshore. The Cayman Islands Department of Tourism Information Centre is located here, as well as West End Primary School and the Charles Kirkconnell International Airport.

Charles Kirkconnell International Airport

Formerly known as Gerrard-Smith International Airport, The Charles Kirkconnell International Airport (CKIA) commenced operations in 1955 when Cayman Brac Airways started an air link to Grand Cayman.

The Airport, which boasts a runway of 6,010 feet long by 150 feet wide, plays an important role in Cayman Brac's development as a top tourist and dive destination catering to a myriad of visitors, including residents who chose to "getaway" from the hustle and bustle of Grand Cayman.



STAKE BAY

On the north side, Stake Bay roughly refers to the middle section of the Island. Stake Bay is the capital of the Island and is where you will find the main Government building, the hospital, the museum, a grocery store and the Island's only high school - the highly respected Layman E. Scott Sr. High School.

The Cayman Brac Museum

The Cayman Brac Museum, the oldest Museum in the Cayman Islands opened its doors to the public on December 3rd, 1983. Through the years our efforts have been focused on preserving the unique history of Cayman Brac & Little Cayman and creating informative exhibits. The Museum's home is the Old Government Administration Building built in 1983 which housed the Post Office, Customs, Treasury and much more under one roof before it was replaced by a new building in 1983.





THE BLUFF


Parrot Reserve. It is home to many endemic flora and fauna species of the Cayman Islands. The Bluff has seen a significant increase in property developments and it also has the Government owned, Cayman Brac Day Care Centre.

BRAC PARROT RESERVE

The Brac Parrot Reserve encompasses 282 acres of contiguous protected land that is dominated by pristine, ancient dry forest on a very rough and rocky terrain. A great diversity of native trees support breeding pairs of the Cayman Brac Parrot as well as other forest birds such as the Red-legged Thrush, White-crowned Pigeon ("Bald Pate") and Black-whiskered Vireo.



LIGHTHOUSE



Visit the Cayman Brac lighthouse, located at the highest point of the Cayman Brac bluff

The Bluff of the Cayman Brac is a plateau made out of karstic limestone on the eastern side of the island. "Brac" actually means Gaelic for bluff. The Bluff reaches a height of 140 feet above sea level and offers a great view of the coastline.




EASTERN DISTRICTS

Continue east to Watering Place, Creek and Spot Bay and you'll find a true Cayman Brac welcome. "Mom and Pop" stores and small local restaurants showcase authentic souvenirs and traditional Caymanian fare. The Cayman Brac Heritage House is located between Creek and Spot Bay and compliments the Cayman Brac Museum, offering reenactments of the country's past, with displays showing how islanders of the past used natural resources to create houses and tools. There are two primary schools, Creek Primary School and Spot Bay Primary School, in this area.



WHAT TO DO ON CAYMAN BRAC

Named for its breathtaking bluff, Cayman Brac is off the beaten track but remains charming, allowing thrill-seekers and nature-lovers to get up close and personal with rare flora, fauna and nature.

Limestone caves and sinkholes contrast waters containing awe-inspiring dives along seawalls and even a sunken ship, as adventurers of all ages can brave the elements in Cayman Brac.

Towering up above, the lush green forests throughout Cayman Brac are a birdwatcher's dream - with endangered parrots, brown boobies and peregrine falcons perched in the canopy. On the ground, a crisscross of hiking trails will lead you to unusual flowers, reptilian habitats and historic sites of all kinds.

Just a 30-minute flight from Grand Cayman, "The Brac" holds untold stories.




SHORE DIVING & SNORKELLING

KAYAKING & CANOEING


Rent a Kayak and take a leisurely paddle around the calm waters off the south coast. Explore the shoreline and view the Island from a different perspective.



CAVES



Explore the Island's Caves. There are many to visit, and more to be discovered as some entrances are still concealed by thick vegetation. Some caves were even used by pirates to stash their treasure chests. Check out the stalactite and stalagmite formations in both the Great Cave and Nani Cave or enjoy views of Spot Bay from Peter's Cave.





ROCK CLIMBING

Enthusiasts have rated Cayman Brac as one of the top ten exotic climbing destinations worldwide. There are 75 routes on offer that have bolts in place for climbers who can abseil from the top of the bluff down to the sea and climb back up again.





BIRD WATCHING

Bird Watching is particularly good from October to April when migrating birds pass through in search of fresh water and warmer weather.

With some 200 species of full and part-time resident birds, the Island is an ornithologist's paradise. Land birds you may see include the rare Cayman Brac Parrot, the Red- legged Thrush and the West Indian Whistling Duck. There are also five seabird colonies. The 310-acre Brac Parrot Reserve was established in 1990 to protect the Brac's endemic parrot and various other species of birds. A two-mile trail through the reserve gives you a chance to see some rare species.





CYCLING


With a variety of cycling route options, it is a great way to see the island. There are coastal loops and inland routes that offer picturesque views of the Caribbean Sea.
